<u>Precepts</u>: The "minimum requirements" for being Catholic are called the Precepts of the Church. They aren't talked about much, perhaps because we don't want to reduce our faith to the bare minimum. The Precepts of the Church are:

- 1. Attending Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation.
- 2. Going to confession annually if not more often or when needed.
- 3. Receiving Holy Communion during Easter. Receiving weekly or daily is encouraged, though.
- 4. Observing laws on fasting and abstinence: one full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday; not eating meat on Fridays during Lent.
- 5. Obeying the marriage laws of the Church.
- 6. Supporting the Church financially or otherwise.

In general, Catholics are basically required to live a Christian life, pray daily, participate in the sacraments, obey the moral law, and accept the teaching of Christ and his Church.
